I. Background of the College with Vision, Mission and Objectives

Background

Sir C R Reddy College was established in the year 1945 and was named after Sir C R Reddy, a great Educationalist and the founder Vice-Chancellor of Andhra University. The college has now become a premier Educational Institution in Andhra Pradesh. The college has been functioning under the registered educational society, “*Sir C R Reddy Educational Institutions*”. The Institution is affiliated to Adikavi Nannaya University, Rajamahendravaram since 2015 and formerly affiliated to Andhra University, Vishakhapatnam. The AISCHE Code of the College is 23921. The college is reorganized by University Grants Commission UGC act 2(f) & 12(B) in the year 1969. The Institution was accorded the status of Autonomy in the academic year 1987-88, and since then functioning as per the regulations of UGC. Recently the Autonomous status of the College is extended from the academic year 2022-23 to 2031-32 for a period of 10 years. The college was accredited at ‘A’ level in consecutive four cycles (2005, 2011, 2017 and 2022) NAAC, Bengaluru. The college was selected as College with Potential for Excellence (CPE) in 2010 by UGC. The college also got ISO 9001:2015 Certification. The college comprising six academic blocks for UG & PG Programmes such as Degree Main Building, Degree Vocational Block, Botany Block, RUSA block, PG Blocks (A, B and C). In addition to academic blocks, there are six supporting blocks such as Central Library, Auditorium, Gymnasium, Bank & Canteen Block, Dining Hall, Distance Education Block, separate Hostels for boys and girls and security rooms.

Curriculum Design and Development:

- The process of **curriculum design and development** at the institution is structured and dynamic, ensuring continuous evaluation and improvement. The curriculum is regularly assessed through meetings of the **Board of Studies (BoS)**, which are conducted for both odd and even semesters, twice a year. These meetings involve a thorough review of the curriculum and syllabus to ensure its relevance and alignment with the latest academic and industry trends. Evaluation of the curriculum and revision of syllabus up to 20% maximum is carried out based on industry standards, student needs, and national/international educational trends. The syllabi were revised and updated regularly. The resolutions made in these meetings are further discussed and ratified by the **Academic Council**.

To maintain relevance and foster the interface between academia and industry, the revision of the syllabus is closely aligned with contemporary industry needs. This ensures that the curriculum meets local, regional, national, and global developmental requirements, as reflected in the **Program Outcomes (POs)** and **Course Outcomes (COs)** of the programs offered by the institution.

The focus of the institution's programs is not only on academic excellence but also on enhancing **employability, entrepreneurship, and skill development**. The syllabus is regularly revised to incorporate modern and contemporary requirements, ensuring that students are equipped with the necessary skills and knowledge to succeed in their careers.

Moreover, the institution integrates **cross-cutting issues** into the curriculum, including **professional ethics, gender, human values, environmental sustainability**, and other frameworks outlined in the **Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs)** and the **National Education Policy (NEP) 2020**. This holistic approach helps foster socially responsible and globally aware graduates.

In addition to the core curriculum, many departments offer **certificate programs, value-added courses, and online courses** from recognized platforms such as **MOOCs, SWAYAM, e-PG Pathshala, NPTEL**, and other similar platforms. These courses help both students and faculty enhance their learning and skill sets, contributing to a broader and more comprehensive educational experience.

This ongoing process of curriculum revision and development ensures that the institution's programs remain current and relevant to the evolving needs of society, industry, and the global community.

- **Teaching-Learning Process:** The Institution follow the student centric teaching methods such as experiential learning, participative learning, problem-solving methodologies that actively engage students in the learning process including the use of innovative and effective teaching strategies, technology integration (ICT Teaching and Learning), and learning resources (e.g., smart classrooms, e-learning platforms). The Institution implanting parent university and APSCHE guidelines in carrying out community service project (CSP) at the end of the second semester, Short Term Internship at the end of the fourth semester and 6 months long term internship in sixth semester.

- **Examination and Evaluation System:** The Institution established a statutory strong and rigid examination cell as per the norms of Autonomous Colleges and UGC Guidelines. The examination cell has been conducted two mid semester examinations for each 30 marks and semester end examinations (SEE) for 60 marks by getting question paper from external paper setters and evaluation of the scrips has been carried out confidentially by external examiners. Similarly, even semester practical examinations have been conducting by appointing external examiner from a reputed Colleges. It is found that the examination process, grading system, transparency, and fairness in assessments. This includes the evaluation of internal and external exams, the process of moderating marks, and the feedback mechanisms.
- **Research and Innovation:** The management constantly encouraging and giving support for research activities, research publications, research projects, collaborations with research bodies, and student involvement in research initiatives by providing seed money to faculty and students to carry out research projects and incentives for research publications.
- **Student Support Systems:** The Institution has been implanting mentor – mentee system with 1: 20 ratio for the academic support such as tutoring, mentoring, career counselling, and extra-curricular activities.

5. The statutory and non-statutory committees as per the UGC regulations are constituted and have been functioning actively. Regular meetings have been organized with agenda and the resolutions of minutes of meeting have been implementing.
6. The Institution constituted students council, which is an effective bridge between the administrative & academic authorities and students. It plays a vital role in the planning and conduct of all student related activities, especially inter-college competition in sports, cultural, academic fests, exhibitions and participation in all institutional activities to enhance their leadership traits and organization skills etc.

Thus, ever since the inception of the college, administration is carried effectively through a decentralized fashion, thinking that this inclusive and participatory approach presents an environment of solidarity and mutual respect ensuring smooth functioning and growth of the institution.

Dean Concept

As per the guidelines of management, the institution introduced the concept of Dean in administration for more decentralization of power for smooth functioning and progress of the college subsequently, governance decided to add more functionaries and statutory committees to coordinate Specific activities. Accordingly, Deans of Academic affairs, Examination, Extension activities, Infrastructure, Research, Student affairs, Industry academia interface, Quality initiatives etc., were constituted with designated Job-Chart to carry out their duties systematically as mentioned under.

- **Quality Assurance Mechanisms:** The Institution established Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) in 2004 to dive the institution into the internal mechanisms for quality assurance, including monitoring and evaluation processes, feedback collection, and their role in institutional improvement. The IQAC meetings are organized least once in every quarter. The agenda, minutes and Action Taken Reports are documented with official signatures and maintained electronically in a retrievable format.
- The institution submitting yearly the Annual Quality Assurance Report (AQAR) to NAAC as per the guidelines by IQAC in second, third or subsequent cycle's accreditation after approved by the Governing Body (GB) of the HEIs.
- **Faculty Recruitment & Development:** The institution recruiting faculty as per the faculty recruitment policy of the Sir C R Reddy Educational Institutions Society. The

institution organizing faculty development programmes (FDP), faculty training programmes, and other professional development initiatives for teachers.

- **Academic Autonomy and Accountability:** As per the guidelines of Autonomous Colleges given by UGC, each department constituted respective board of studies (BoS) with head of the department as chairman of BoS. Each BoS is constituted as per the guidelines with university nominee, two external subjects, alumni, industrialist and student representative, and all other faculty as members. The meeting of BoS is conducted twice (for Odd and Even semesters) in an academic year. An extensive discussion is carried out on agenda point and resolutions are taken after a fruitful discussion, and then ratified in an Academic Council.

The entire campus is under CCTV surveillance, nearly 126 CC Cameras recording/capturing the activities and are monitoring continuously.

The college provides lift and ramp facility for differently abled students. First-Aid room in the Health Centre. Business lab for Management students, Student Computer ratio for Computer Science students is 1:5. Virtual Classrooms and Digital Classrooms, Math-Stat Laboratory, Simulation Laboratory & ELL for Communicative English are special features of the college. Skill Development Centre with Laptops and Tabs are some of the special features of the college. The Botanical Garden with Herbal Medicinal Plants and Green House, A separate space for Capacity Building Centre is allotted in which CRT, placement drives, Psychological counselling & life skills orientation takes place

5. Student and Stakeholder Feedback

- **Student Feedback Mechanism:** The institution collects feedback from students regarding courses, teaching, infrastructure, and overall experience through Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) for every semester in an academic year in online and office line mode. After collecting the feedback, it is analysed and brought to the notice of concern department and faculty, and then action taken and report is uploaded in college website. 1.2.2 Roles and Responsibilities
